On September 12, 1992, she flew into space on the Shuttle Endeavour for mission STS 47. As mission specialist, she was responsible for conducting scientific experiments exploring weightlessness, motion sickness and bone cells while on the shuttle. She left NASA in 1993 to start the Jemison Group that researched, markets and develops science and technology for daily life.
