

Academic Integrity Violation and Sanction Rubric

Violations below are examples and do not represent the full range of behaviors that violate Gonzaga University's Academic Integrity Policy (AIP).

Levels of Violation	History	Sanctions
<p>Level I (Minimum): Historically, the most common; lack of proper citation; overstepping the boundary of collaborative group learning, mitigating circumstances</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Plagiarism in an <u>isolated section</u> on an assignment in which other sources are appropriately documented, e.g., one unattributed source within a multi-source, multi-page essay b. Unauthorized assistance given or received, usually on an <u>isolated section</u> of an assignment, quiz, or exam c. Signing into class on behalf of another student d. Registering for a course to save a seat for another student with a later registration period <p><i>*At this level students may be allowed to earn back points by successfully completing make-up work. Arrangement is between the student and reporting faculty member. See AIP 5.5.1 for more information.</i></p>	First Offense	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Grade of 0 on exam, assignment • Academic Integrity Training Online Course
	Second Offense	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Automatic Level II, First Offense
<p>Level II (Medium): Deliberate violations covering a <u>significant portion</u> of the course assessment</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Plagiarism in a <u>significant portion of</u> an assignment or paper, e.g., two or more unattributed sources within a multi-source, multi-page essay b. Possession or use of an unauthorized aid used on <u>most of</u> a quiz or exam c. Unauthorized assistance given or received, <u>in large part (more than an isolated section)</u>, on an assignment, quiz or exam 	First Offense	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Full or partial letter grade reduction in course • Meeting with CSAS to develop a plan to prevent further violations • Academic Integrity Training Online Course
	Second Offense	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Automatic Level III, First Offense
<p>Level III (Severe): Flagrant disregard for the policy; three or more violations</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Plagiarism so extensive that a major course assignment worth half or more of the course grade contains little or no original work; multiple, lengthy instances of plagiarism in a comprehensive examination or dissertation b. Engaging in contract cheating – purchase or sale of a paper, e.g. from an essay mill c. Cheating on a comprehensive or other qualifying examination d. Forgery of academic documents or documents created for purpose of supporting false claims to extend academic deadlines, e.g. forged medical documentation or family death certificates, alteration of a transcript e. Compromising security resources to manipulate academic records f. Any violation of the AIP related to work that has been (or plans to be) disseminated as a published work or at a conference presentation 	First Offense	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Grade of F in course • Suspension for one semester
	Second Offense	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dismissal from the University
