#### **International Studies Language Requirement**

All International Studies majors are required to take six (6) credits at the 300-level or higher in a modern language other than English. Students may need to take language courses at the 100 or 200-level, depending on their previous studies of the language and where they are placed in the sequence of courses.

NOTE: If a given language is only offered at Gonzaga through the 202 level students may, with *prior approval* from the Int'l Studies Dept. Chair, complete their upper-division language courses abroad, or at another approved domestic institution. If no such alternative is feasible students may, with *prior approval* from the Int'l Studies Dept. Chair, take two semesters of a second language that is relevant to their course of study. Transfer students who have not previously studied a language will be required to complete courses through the 202 level.
