Peter C. Phan, a native of Vietnam, emigrated as a refugee to the U.S.A. in 1975. He earned three doctorates (in Rome and London) and has been awarded three honorary doctorates from Chicago Theological Union, the College of Our Lady of the Elms, and Virginia theological Seminary. Currently he holds the Ignacio Ellacuría Chair of Catholic Social Thought at Georgetown University. He was the first non-Anglo to be elected President of the Catholic Theological Society of America, which also recognized his distinguished achievement in theology by awarding him in 2010 the John Courtney Murray Award, the highest honor of the Catholic Theological Society of America. His recent books and scholarly articles develop a theological understanding of migration.
