As lab manager and project coordinator, I recruited participants, scheduled visits, and conducted home, park, and laboratory visits with parents and their 24-36-month-old children. Data collection included reporting on individuals' behavior using the Maternal Behavior for Preschoolers Q-Set (Posada et al., 1998) and the Attachment Q-Set (Waters, 1995), administering lab tasks to families, including co-construction stories with parent-child dyads, Adult Attachment narratives with parents, executive functioning measures with children (i.e. The Dimensional Change Card Sort task and day-night Stroop-like task), and parental questionnaires regarding marital conflict and other family relationship topics. In addition, during these visits I video-recorded child-parent interactions during free play and clean up tasks, and I led a team of undergraduate students on coding of the behaviors during these interactions. I oversaw data management which included training undergraduate students on the Maternal Behavior for Preschoolers Q-Set and Attachment Q-Set; overseeing undergraduate data entry, transcription of parental narratives, and child-parent co-construction tasks, as well as organizing and overseeing their participation in coding of Adult Attachment narratives.

During my first year on this study I managed a project assessing the math literacy skills of preschool-aged dual language learners. This entailed recruiting preschools and preschool teachers, coordinating and participating in data collection by administering standardized assessments with ELL preschoolers, and supervising undergraduate students' involvement in data collection. In addition, I was involved in developing children's storybooks, in English and Spanish, which focus on promoting math language use during parent-child dialogic reading. We are currently using the storybooks in an intervention study focused on increasing parents' engagement in their children's early numeracy development.

As the project manager for *Project SALUD: Healthy Midwest Latino Families Project*, I recruited 119 Latino families with 5th-6th grade children. I traveled to surrounding counties and recruited participants by speaking to families at various events such as Purdue Extension centers, school parent-teacher conferences, and adult English-learning classes. For these first two years of the study, I was in charge of scheduling home visits, preparing visit materials, and conducting home visits with families. During home visits, I measured health indicators such as participants' height, weight, and blood pressure. I also instructed families on completing a home interview consisting of standardized measures, and taught

them how to collect and store salivary cortisol samples, as well as how to use a Fitbit activity trackers that we used to collect additional health information. In addition, I trained and supervised undergraduate research assistants' involvement in the data collection. Further, I translated interview measures and project materials from English to Spanish, and was involved in writing an R21 grant proposal, and journal articles.

I served as a research assistant for the National Science Foundation-funded project by helping conduct home visits with mother-child dyads. Data collection consisted of observing maternal behavior during home visits using the Maternal Behavior for Preschoolers Q-Sort. In addition, I administered the Peabody Picture Vocabulary Test with children. I also participated in coding narratives collected during the visits using the MacArthur Attachment Story Completion Task, coding of Adult Attachment Narratives, and coding of Separation Anxiety Task narratives.
