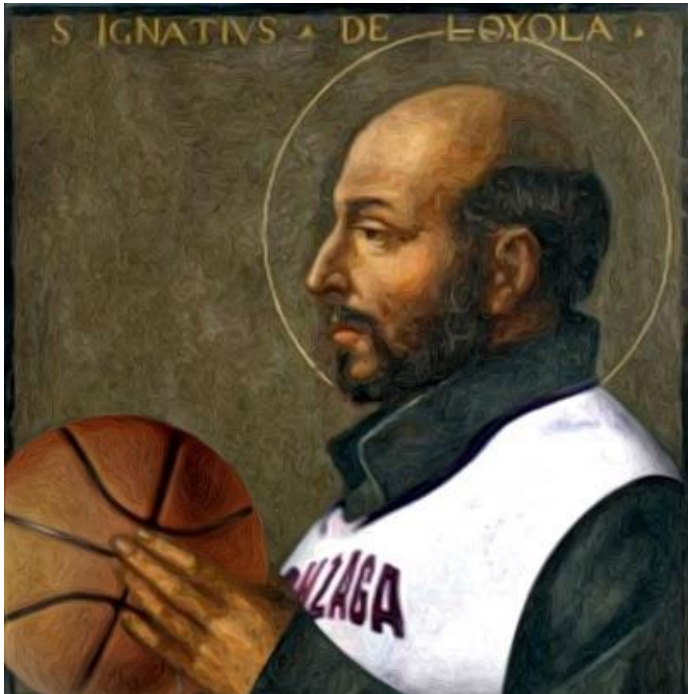

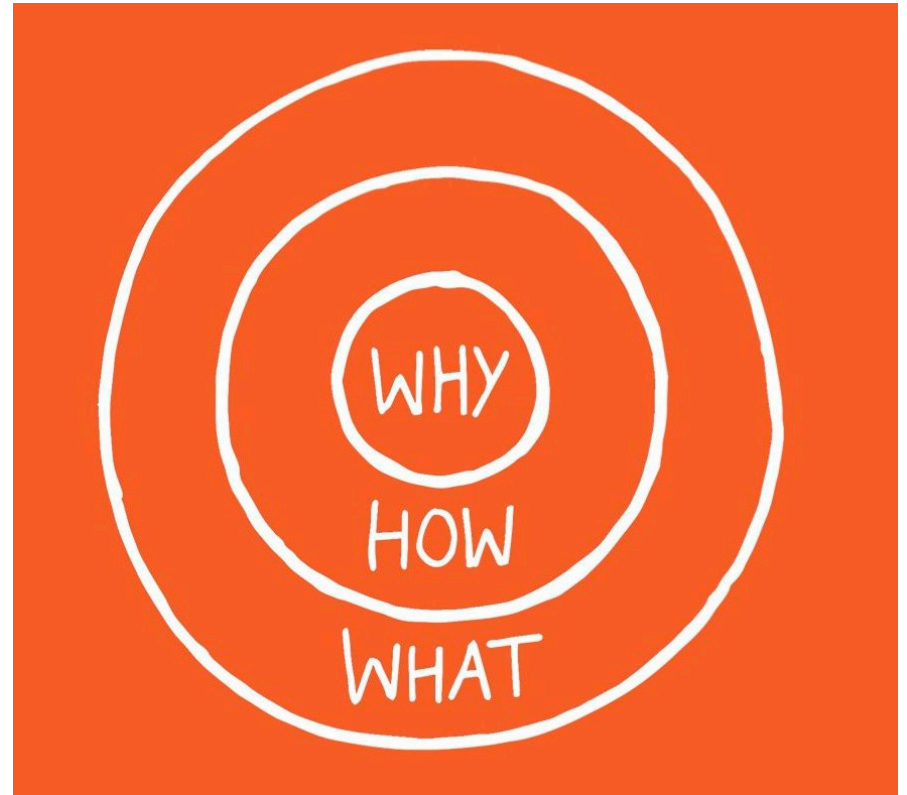

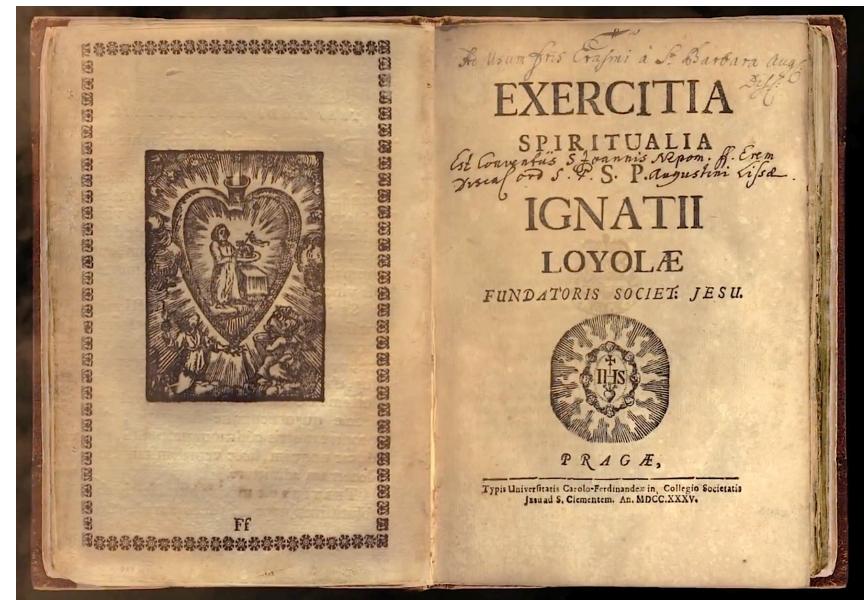

(Adopted in 2013, Modified in 2017)

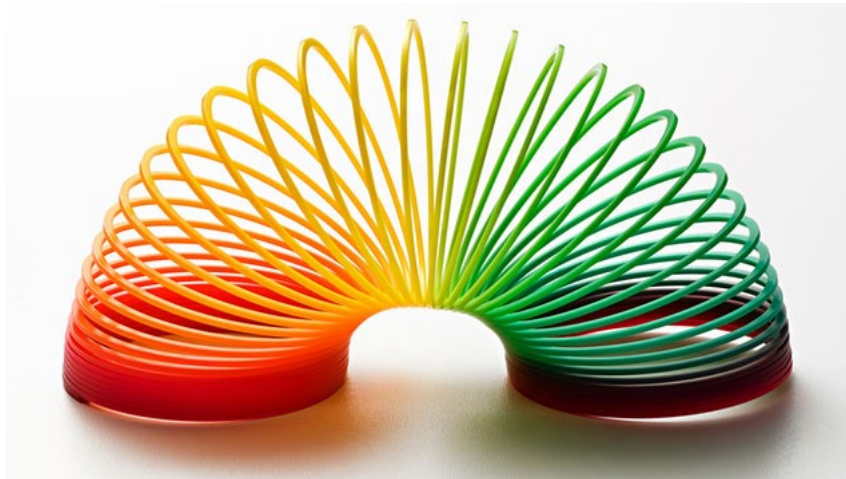
Gonzaga University is an exemplary learning community that educates students for lives of leadership and service for the common good.

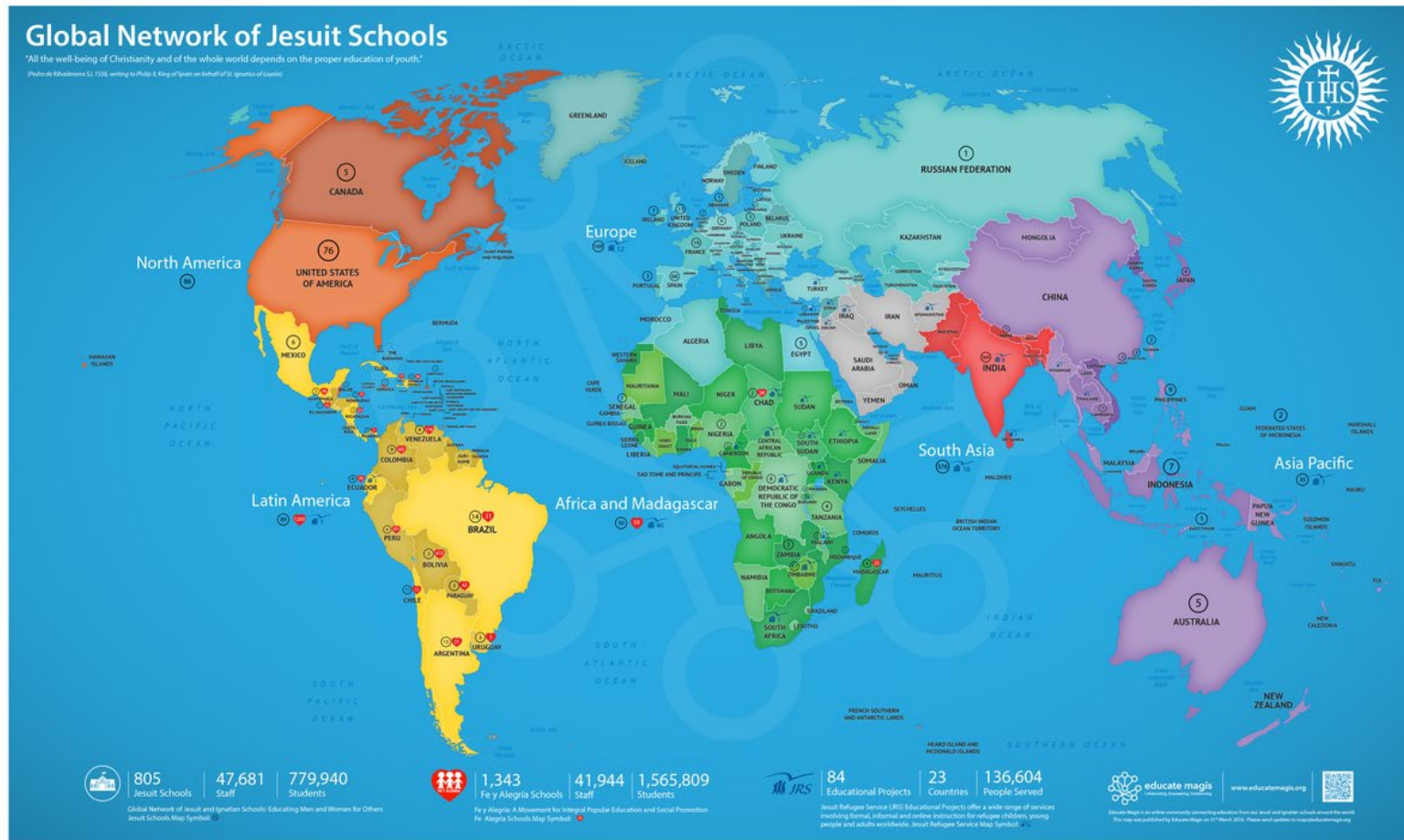
