The relationships we enjoy in this community, this region, and throughout the country, put us in a place to embrace the future with great enthusiasm and vigor. **You** are a part of this movement. **You** play an integral role in where we go in the next step of our journey.

Seven years ago, shortly after his inauguration, Gonzaga University's president, Thayne McCulloh, challenged Gonzaga to raise \$250 million in the largest capital campaign in University history. At that time, we knew that our current and future students needed access to higher education. They needed the resources to unleash their potential.

They needed you.

We are so proud to announce that in true Zag fashion, we far surpassed our campaign goal, raising \$355.4 million from more than 40,000 donors.

\$353 million.

More than \$110 million (nearly one-third of the total) raised in **Gonzaga Will: The Campaign for Our Future** has gone directly toward the development of 284 new student scholarship funds. This has continued to support enrollment of the most academically strong and diverse classes in Gonzaga history. We will continue to focus on growing our endowment to help more families than ever realize their dream of becoming Zags.

"When we began this journey, we understood that this campaign would serve as the transformational force for the institution, and that we must turn a corner to remain competitive in the higher education landscape," President McCulloh said. "This will change the way our institution operates and will allow us to do even more to keep Gonzaga competitive and thriving."

Leadership Changes Announced

Following the retirement of Academic Vice President Patricia O’Connell Killen (’74), Gonzaga began the search for a Provost and Senior Vice President. In the interim, Dean Elisabeth Mermann-Jozwiak served as our Academic Vice President. At the conclusion of the 2017-18 academic year, President McCulloh named **Lizbeth J. Martin** as interim in the new Provost role. She most recently served as provost and vice president for academic affairs at Holy Names University in Oakland, California. While a search for a permanent provost is underway, Dr. Martin will assist in creating an effective provost structure, as well as find worthy successors for four current deanships: the schools of Education, Engineering and Applied Science, Nursing and Human Physiology, and Leadership Studies.

Leading growth and innovation at Gonzaga is **James Angelosante**, vice president for administration. Angelosante is the former executive director and chief financial officer for the University of Washington’s facilities services. At GU, he will oversee several administrative and business support operations, including human resources; plant and construction services; security, safety and emergency preparedness; sustainability; GU Event Services Team (GUEST); Marketing & Communications; Hemmingson Center and auxiliary services.

Propelling Our Online Presence

A multiyear collaborative project led to a rebuilt public website (gonzaga.edu) and our first intranet site, **myGU**, unveiled in early 2018. Developed with years of input from users ranging from employees to prospective students, current students to alumni, these new websites offer better and easier ways to explore, learn, work and connect with Gonzaga. Important advances include a responsive, mobile-friendly design and a focus on improved accessibility for people with disabilities.

Unique features of gonzaga.edu include the Purpose Finder and Global Impact Map. The Purpose Finder presents prospective students with topics such as “Growing the Economy” or “Protecting the Planet,” offering stories about students and alumni pursuing these interests, possible academic areas of study and more. The Global Impact Map shows locations around the world where Gonzaga students, faculty and alumni have learned and served.

Family Losses

Gonzaga mourned the passing of two beloved community members this past year: **Don Herak** and **Sister Laura Michels, S.N.J.M.**

Herak, a '46 graduate and longtime supporter, regent and trustee, provided his insights to many aspects of Gonzaga's enterprise regularly since 1957. He received the Distinguished Alumni Merit Award in 1982, an Honorary Doctor of Laws degree in 2004, and the Ignatian Spirit Award, along with his wife, Carol, in 2010. Don passed away on March 9.

Sister Laura was a beacon of goodwill on campus for the past 30 years. She was a chaplain for Welch and Lincoln halls and for both the baseball and women's basketball teams, as well as a chaplain and coordinator of liturgies for University Ministry. Sister Laura passed away on February 7.

Champs Again

Gonzaga women's and men's basketball teams both captured the West Coast Conference regular-season and tournament championships, and played in the NCAA tournaments – men for the 21st consecutive time, women for the 10th. The Men's team advanced to the Sweet Sixteen. Zag baseball captured the WCC tournament championship and advanced to the NCAA tournament for the second time in three years.

Women's rowing continued its streak of success with its fourth straight WCC title and a berth in the NCAA championships. Men's track placed a record seven runners in the NCAA West preliminary rounds. Zag student-athletes were No. 1 in the nation for Graduation Success Rate at 99 percent, and Academic Progress Rate at 998 out of 1,000. In addition, they performed more than 4,000 hours of community service and outreach this past year.



Moving Toward Stronger Diversity Efforts

During the last year, Gonzaga took considerable action on its commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion. The addition of Joan Iva Fawcett as the assistant dean of diversity, inclusion, community and equity led to greater collaboration among campus groups including administration, student development and academics.

The comprehensive website dedicated to diversity now shows students, faculty, staff, parents and the public where Gonzaga has been in its journey to improved inclusivity and where the university is in terms of progress on the commitments made by leadership.

The President's Council on Equity, Inclusion and Intercultural Awareness created a number of small work groups to assist in specific measures, including the response to last year's campuswide climate survey, which identified key areas for improvement. There are also work groups focused on the support of undocumented students and the reporting and resolution of bias incidents.

Global Competencies in the University Core

With the new University Core in its second year of implementation, the Center for Global Engagement has adapted and developed courses to meet learning outcomes. Richard Menard, director of the Study Abroad program, says this has been a particular motivation at Gonzaga-in-Florence, which allows students in any major to study there.

Outside Florence, opportunities have expanded in Zambia. Biology's Bill Ettinger taught at the Chimfunshi Wildlife Orphanage for the ninth time, where Chief Diversity Officer Raymond Reyes joined him to teach a course on leadership and social change. Professor of Psychology Anna Marie Medina and Nursing's Julie Derzay teamed up for the Gonzaga in Glasgow program, offering courses in lifespan development and religion.

Partnerships with Pontificia Universidad Javeriana in Colombia continue to grow, with the addition this year of the School of Leadership Studies.

ENGINEERING DESIGN: The Center for Engineering Design & Entrepreneurship showcases senior projects annually. Many design projects are commissioned by sponsors from the private and public sectors.

Professorship Chairs

Arnold Chair: Kirk Besmer

Kirk Besmer, associate professor of philosophy, is the Alphonse A. and Geraldine F. Arnold Distinguished Professor, a seasoned teacher and scholar who is recognized for his or her contribution to liberal arts education.

“Technology and the Human Condition” is the theme Besmer has selected for the annual Arnold Lectures for the next three years. His own research and teaching in the philosophy of technology has taught him how much understanding our technologically saturated world requires a multidisciplinary approach. “Academic study of technology from a humanities-based perspective cannot be limited to a single disciplinary perspective, for no single disciplinary perspective can adequately address the full impact of technology on society,” he said.

Mozilo Chair: Danielle Xu

Danielle Xu, professor of finance, holds the Phyllis and Angelo Mozilo Chair of Business Administration. She is considered “the ideal candidate to advance the

objectives of compassionate capitalism” – the focus of the chair for this term.

Born and raised in China, Xu received graduate degrees from the University of Arizona. She joined the Gonzaga School of Business Administration faculty in 2005.

The School of Business has four other endowed or named professorships: John L. Aram Chair of Business Ethics (Brian Steverson), Erwin Graue Professor of Economics (Kevin Henrickson), Kinsey M. Robinson Professor of Business Administration (Paul Buller), and Pigott Professor in Entrepreneurship (Todd Finkle).

Smithmoore P. Myers Chair: Lynn Daggett

Law Professor Lynn M. Daggett holds the inaugural Smithmoore P. Myers Chair, named after the former dean. Daggett’s scholarship is interdisciplinary, informed by her Ph.D. in Education and her experience as a school attorney. Her current scholarship is at the intersection of education law, tort law, and education research, policy and practice.

Interdisciplinary teaching promotes student engagement and learning and helps students recognize that a variety of perspectives can be brought to bear on issues. Teaching across academic disciplines in a First Year Seminar, Biology Professor Brook Swanson and Dance Professor Suzanne Ostersmith developed “Beautiful Weapons,” a scientific presentation on the fiddler crab through the language of dance. Gonzaga Repertory Dance Company members performed at a dozen regional universities this year to teach about bio-diversity and evolution.

During the 2017-18 academic year, the Center for Undergraduate Research and Creative Inquiry provided funding to 104 College of Arts & Sciences students to participate in conferences and to conduct research in disciplines representative of the diverse content offered by the College. The College also debuted the Morris Fellowship program, which offers funded opportunities for students in the humanities and social sciences to conduct research on topics of their choosing under the guidance of faculty mentors; and an additional seven College students completed successful internships in the Seattle Summer Biomedical Internship program. Students also earned recognition at conferences and competitions at home and farther afield, receiving multiple individual awards at the regional and national Model UN conferences, 2018 Spokane Intercollegiate Research Conference, and Mathematical Association of America MathFest conference.

To improve their intercultural competency, 291 College students traveled overseas for study abroad programs, and numerous faculty members led programs such as Gonzaga in Zambezi, Literary London, and an archaeological dig in Turkey. Four faculty members continued to strengthen Gonzaga’s relationship with Pontificia Universidad Javeriana in Colombia by collaborating with colleagues in Cali and Bogotá on projects within shared research categories. In addition, two students – one of whom also completed a term as a Boren Fellow in Tanzania – earned Fulbright English Teaching Assistantships in Spain and Germany, and two students secured positions as assistant language teachers in Japan through the competitive Japan Exchange and Teaching program.

School of Business Administration continues to be one of the largest academic enterprises on campus, with business majors making up nearly a quarter of the student body. The most popular undergraduate concentrations are accounting, finance and marketing.

One of the major focuses in strategic planning for the SBA over the last year centered on lifelong learning – academic programming for alumni and friends. Two events (one in Spokane, one in Seattle) were well-received. Other events that continue drawing alumni and community members to campus are the Aram Lecture on Business Ethics and the Pigott Entrepreneurship Lecture.

Competition continues to be a hallmark of business student success. Four sophomores brought home awards in the Price Waterhouse Cooper

Gonzaga’s team at the Chartered Financial Analyst Institute Research Challenge won first place for presentation, second place for written report and second place overall in the local competition. Six Zags advanced to the finals in four competitive events with the Collegiate Distributive Education Clubs of America (DECA). Among 65 teams in the Northwest Entrepreneur Competition, six GU teams were finalists.

For the second time, Gonzaga business students received an invitation to visit with billionaire Warren Buffet to learn from one of the most successful business minds of all time.

Speaking of entrepreneurship, the Summer in Williston internship program in North Dakota received a community partnership award in this, its fifth year, providing Hogan Entrepreneurial Leadership Program graduates with experience and employment.

Business students, staff and faculty also continue to support vital agencies like Second Harvest Food Bank with their time and service.

A Memorandum of Understanding with the Office of Catholic Schools, Archdiocese of Seattle and the Fulcrum Foundation shows intent to create a talent pipeline for education students with the objective of sustaining Catholic education.

Students provided physical education and nutrition classes at Trinity Catholic school; two faculty and one graduate served as crisis counselors at Freeman High School, special education graduate students volunteered to coach the Gonzaga Bulldog Exceptional Hockey team; M.A. in Teaching English as a Second Language (MA/ TESL) and Master of Initial Teaching (MIT) students offered free English as a Second Language (ESL) classes to adult immigrants and refugees; and Principal Certification candidates served a minimum of 540 hours in their internships.

Faculty provided leadership and service to multiple community organizations: Excelerate Success, Spokane County Cradle-to-Career Network, Hillyard Children's Zone, ParaSport of Spokane, Lutheran Family Services and Kootenai Health Center. Faculty and students provide countless hours of service-learning to those who are elderly or homeless, attending alternative schools, living with disabilities, veterans, and those who are at-risk.

Alumna Susan Poindexter, a teacher at Shadle Park High in Spokane, won Eastern Washington University's Teacher of the Month for November 2017. Forty-five individuals attended the Early Childhood Leadership Summit to discuss early childhood education and resources for all families, and more than 200 participated in the annual celebration of Catholic schools featuring Spokane Bishop Thomas Daly.

First Destination Survey results for graduates of SEAS continue to be strong. Top employers include the aerospace industry (Boeing and Northrop Grumman), the military and government agencies.

The newest of its undergraduate programs, Engineering Management, received ABET accreditation. SEAS students are pursuing graduate studies in steadily increasing numbers, with alumni enrolling at top U.S. universities such as Purdue, Stanford, University of Washington and Notre Dame.

Many graduates also pursue service opportunities such as the Peace Corps and a program modelled after the Peace-Corps Masters (one year of study followed by two years in the Peace Corps).

Students are also increasingly engaged in project-based efforts. SEAS will support 56 senior design projects in 2018-19. Of these, 30 to 40 percent are student-proposed projects.

Dean Steve Silliman was awarded a Jefferson Science Fellow with the U.S. Agency for International Development. The one-year appointment began August 2018. Stepping in as Interim Dean is Joe Fedock, Ph.D., previously from Montana State University.

Summer Fellows Programs in Arizona and Afghanistan

In 2018, the Center for Civil and Human Rights launched a summer fellows program, offering a \$5,000 stipend to first- or second-year Law students. The first recipients were Alejandra Lopez, who interned at the Florence Immigrant and Refugee Rights Project in Tucson, Arizona, and Muskaw Safi, who worked with Integrity Watch Afghanistan to monitor corruption within the Afghan judiciary.

Not a Moot Point

Law students are competitive by nature, so it's no surprise that Gonzaga students consistently bring home titles from national events. At the National Trademark Moot Court Competition, Norann Beidas and Kelli Cummings were the first team in GU history to advance to the final rounds. The duo advanced to the Sweet Sixteen and then the Elite Eight. Of the 46 teams, the Zags ranked eighth heading into the final rounds. Additionally, Beidas won the prestigious award for second "Best Spoken Advocate."

Leadership Update

Jacob H. Rooksby, J.D., Ph.D., became the new dean on June 1. He previously served as associate dean of administration and associate professor of law at Duquesne University School of Law in Pittsburgh. A renowned expert in intellectual property law, he brings a love for legal scholarship, administrative expertise and a passion for higher education. He began his legal career in Richmond, Virginia, at the firm of McGuireWoods, LLP, where he practiced higher education law. Rooksby is the author of "The Branding of the American Mind: How Universities Capture, Manage, and Monetize Intellectual Property and Why It Matters," published in 2016 by Johns Hopkins University Press.

Effective June 1, 2018, the former School of Professional Studies became the School of Leadership Studies, reflecting a response to ongoing demand for leadership training. It encompasses three degrees – master’s in communications leadership, master’s in organizational leadership, and doctorate in leadership studies. Its influence extends to undergrads through the Comprehensive Leadership Program and well beyond Spokane through online learning.

Opportunities for collaboration continued with the University of Washington-Gonzaga University Regional Health Partnership

75 Comprehensive Leadership Program alumni gathered for the first engagement opportunity in Seattle

19 students participated in CLP’s Gonzaga-in-Zambezi study abroad program

2 leadership fishbowls and **2** lunchtime leadership events provided additional access to experts

and with Pontificia Universidad Javeriana in Bogota, Colombia. Students also enjoyed immersion experiences with leaders at 10 companies, including Boeing, Starbucks and Amazon; others traveled to L.A. to visit Homeboy Industries.

The Women Lead conferences in Spokane and Seattle were again a resounding success, another step forward in the launch of a Women and Leadership certificate, which took place near the end of the academic year. Looking ahead, plans are underway for the development of a Center for Servant Leadership.

Nursing faculty will serve as fellows for Gonzaga’s place-based initiative work, drawing on the strengths and opportunities of northeast Spokane. They also continue to provide expertise for regional councils, the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education, and even the School of Nursing in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam.

Additional collaboration with the UW-GU Regional Health Partnership is underway, with three Gonzaga faculty members from Human Physiology providing instruction to UW medical students. The department is also advocating for more interprofessional education through expansion of simulation labs and exam rooms.

In the last three years, Nursing has seen growth from 45 students to 190 in the

Doctor of Nursing Practice program. The Nurse Anesthesia Program has expanded to 12 students per cohort, and just graduated the first class of students with the title Doctor of Nurse Anesthesia Practice. The nurse anesthesia students participated in two elementary school science and health fairs, and taught airway management skills to WSU nursing students and medics at Fairchild Air Force Base.


AS OF MAY 31, 2018, IN MILLIONS

ENDOWMENT AND LIFE INCOME




Endowments and life income values include all assets, regardless of restriction
