One of the most powerful ways to stand out to employers is by describing what you accomplished during your past experiences, rather than simply reporting on the tasks you performed. By creating accomplishment statements (on a résumé) and accomplishment stories (in an interview) you will effectively illustrate how you can bring these same skills and results to a future employer.

The STAR Formula can help you answer interview questions efficiently and effectively, and describe your experience on a resume or cover letter in specific and succinct detail.



Identify the situation (Your employer, job title, location, etc).

Task

What was the problem you solved or the responsibilities you were charged with?

Action

What steps did you take to solve the problem or complete the task?

Result

Explain the results and quantify them. Use data to reflect outcomes (savings, sales, recognition, etc.)
