- b. Chief of Staff Kim May

- c. Treasurer Maurie Harbick

- Budget update: GSBA Administrative Fund (money for Executive Staff Salaries, general office supplies, and retreats): \$153,000 budgeted, but over the summer, the amount was cut down to \$125,000. 57% remains for the semester.

- GSBA Programming Fund (money for GSBA Diversity & Inclusion Department and all other GSBA activities and programming): \$94,000 budgeted.
  - Total shortage is \$10,000, but this likely won't be an issue as he is currently budget crunching.
  - Donations helped fill Green Fund and fund the Marc E Bassey concert on Feb. 8.
  - 55% of salary allotment remaining. Emails were to Executive Staff members last semester to remind them to stay within their average hours.
  - Braxton: Why did we go \$2,500 over budget for orientation? Maurie: For programming for incoming first-years. Sodexo pays half for food services. Funds also went for the first-year reusable water bottle gift. Though we went over a little, it is not of concern.
- d. Elections Commissioners Fiona Sutherland and Natalie Sparks
- Requesting assistance during ResHallRallies and Elections Information Sessions.
  - At the Information Sessions, there will be a panel of current GSBA members providing insight and answering questions about GSBA and their positions.
  - ResHallRallying in Coughlin and Kennedy.
  - Voting ends at the end of March but starting earlier to allow more time for publicity.
  - Morgan: Do you have posters made? Fiona: No. Not yet. Morgan: RAs will distribute any posters or fliers for you if you leave them in their boxes.
